My (now) husband Nick and I became ASAP special needs fosters when we were graduate students at UCSB, over 10 years ago. We hosted several lovely felines who eventually were able to find their forever homes before meeting Lucita, a sweet tuxedo who had spent far too much time in the shelter.

Lu had developed an ulcer during prolonged shelter stays (she'd been returned multiple times) and was having problems keeping food down when we took her in as our newest charge in 2011. Extraordinarily sweet, always seeking a lap to curl into a cat-ball upon and a spot to place a wet nose kiss, Lu won us over (despite my promise that fostering meant no long-term cat commitments). When she was returned for the second time by an adopter due to her persistent stomach issues, we decided to make her a permanent part of our family.

Elizabeth and her husband were musicians and often on the road. Spaz travelled with them, and during a stop in Santa Barbara, she had managed to escape. They searched desperately for her but despite their best efforts, they could not find her. When COVID-19 hit, they moved back with Elizabeth's mother, way out in Missouri, and Elizabeth said it was like losing Spaz all over again. But ASAP and Spaz had other ideas! We were determined to get Spaz back to her person and through the generousity of one volunteer who donated miles and another volunteer who was willing to make the trip with Spaz, we made a joyful reunion happen!


