Cassie's Curious Case of Lungworm

Our Wellness team recently encountered a cat with a very rare affliction: lungworm, a parasite that lays its eggs in an affected cat's lungs. Young Cassie, a 2-month-old kitten found roaming an avocado farm with his parents, was brought in with a trifecta of ailments: coccidia, giardia, and lungworms.

While we're no strangers to coccidia and giardia in the shelter and were able to treat Cassie with relative ease, lungworm was certainly a new one. More commonly found in rodents and pigs, lungworms are a type of parasite that can be fatal if left untreated – but lucky for Cassie, our team was up for the task.

Treating Cassie immediately with Panacur dewormer, he was placed in an incubator with an oxygen generator to increase his oxygen intake. After a couple of weeks, his condition improved and the lungworms began to die off, slowly being reabsorbed by his body.

While a critical step toward rehabilitating him, the process of lungworm dying caused inflammation in his lungs, so our team placed him on medication to help him breathe more easily while his lungs heal. With about a dime-sized area in each lung that will accept air, the combination of his medication and the incubator's oxygen generator helps support him with each breath.

He's healing well and is just as bouncy as ever, loving attention and playtime as every young kitten should, and soon enough his lungs will be fully healthy again and he'll be ready for adoption. We're here to help every cat we can, even if it means exploring new treatments and diagnosing unusual and rare conditions!



Cassie was found with two adult feral cats, presumed to be his parents. They are currently being monitored by our team.



Lungworms are spread through ingestion of the parasite, often through eating an infected slug or snail.



Snips and Sticks: Caring for Cats on the Go

With our mobile spay/neuter care unit fully refurbished, our Wellness team has officially taken to the road, recently holding two spay clinics in Santa Maria this past November.

Heading toward Atkinson Park to assist an individual with over a dozen cats at his residence, our team managed to trap and alter 10 outdoor cats and one indoor cat. While working on the outdoor cats, a local



woman rolled up on her bike with a very cute cat tucked in her jacket. At her request, we agreed to neuter her cat and gave him appropriate vaccines as well. We additionally checked in on several local

working cats in North County, performing various exams to ensure everyone was happy and healthy.

Following the success of our first mobile clinic in Atkinson Park, we returned a few weeks later for more. Working with our North County team, we trapped 14 cats from various colonies in the area, performing surgeries for four cats and two semi-feral kittens. We even had four people that saw us in the area run home to bring us their cats to alter. Overall, our Atkinson Park clinics were a huge success.

Seeing how effective our mobile clinics have been, we are already planning for more in December – though costs for the vaccines we distribute are slowly adding up. Socks Found His Footing in Foster

Our expansive foster network is an amazing resource for ASAP, allowing cats a chance to grow outside of the shelter, giving certain fosters the opportunity for a “trial run” adoption, and creating a space in our shelter for the next needy cat we meet.

We recently connected with one of our amazing fosters, Lenny, about her experience with ASAP alum Socks, adopted from ASAP as a baby over six years ago. After his owner moved to a medical facility, Socks wasn’t doing well with the other resident animals on site so he was surrendered to ASAP. Having a hard time adjusting to shelter life, frequently hissing and growling while near cats, our team tried placing him in one of our Working Cats enclosures to give him a bit more space, but this only caused him to isolate and retreat into his outdoor igloo.



Our team managed to find him a foster – enter Lenny – and within just a few days he was back to his normal, happy self. “Fostering Socks was one of the best experiences I’ve ever had in my life,” says Lenny. “He only took a couple of days to come out of his carrier, and after that he was the sweetest boy ever.”

Back to his cuddle bug self, Socks bloomed while in foster, spending most of his time sleeping in Lenny’s bed. Despite being a bit shy and initially sensitive to loud noises (as most cats are), Socks was able to overcome his fear of sudden disturbances, such as doors opening and remotes accidentally being dropped. “In the mornings he would squeak until we fed him, and at night he would be very playful,” says Lenny. His favorite toy during his time at foster was a small yellow coil, and after getting comfortable around Lenny he thoroughly enjoyed flopping on his back for belly rubs.

Our foster program makes a huge difference for many of the cats in our care, providing them a safe space to come out of their shell and get the much-needed attention and love that all cats crave.

All Smiles from the Scrapyard Seven

One of our favorite partners, C.A.R.E.4Paws, recently forwarded a request for assistance with a litter of cats living in a trailer within a scrapyard near Santa Maria. Since we've been making an effort to expand our reach into North County, we were happy to accept the task.

The request came from a woman on behalf of her brother – for confidentiality purposes, they will henceforth be identified as Jane and Austin. Jane informed us that Austin and his wife had been living in a scrapyard trailer for decades, and were currently taking care of seven cats. A few weeks prior to this call for help, Austin's wife had passed away, leaving him overwhelmed by the responsibility for these seven valued companions.

To make matters worse, his trailer took serious damage from a large storm that swept the area, breaking his generator and worsening his living conditions to the point that he needed to leave the scrapyard. Before pursuing transitional housing, though, he needed to make a plan for his cats.

Connecting with Austin through C.A.R.E.4Paws, our team followed his GPS coordinates and met him at his trailer, where seven super friendly cats were excited to make our acquaintance. Our Wellness team was thrilled to see that other than some fleas, all seven cats were happy, healthy, and very obviously loved their entire lives.

Entrusting his cats with our team, Austin was able to move to Oregon with his sister Jane supporting him, where he is now pursuing transitional housing – and his cats are in good hands. Lovingly nicknamed the Scrapyard Seven, these kitties are now in ASAP's care and on their ways to finding their forever homes.

Located at 1213 State Street, Suite L, Cat Therapy partners with ASAP Cats to help our kitties get adopted, offering a unique space that gives them plenty of room to run around and play, while also letting passersby see their cute little faces.

Essentially acting as a superstar ASAP foster, Cat Therapy takes in some of our most outgoing cats on a temporary basis to give them exposure and let them grow in a different environment than the shelter. We provide them with all the necessary vaccines and medical work, and if any of them suffer from illness or need medical attention we bring them back to the shelter, rehabilitate them, and drop them back off at Cat Therapy when they're feeling better – just like we would for any foster.

Owned by our good friend Catalina Esteves, Cat Therapy currently has almost a dozen adoptable ASAP cats, each ready to meet you the next time you're heading downtown for a play or a bite to eat.
